

Sharing of Our Vision

Preparing Ourselves for Worship During the Musical Prelude....



Today we focus on Mary's song which is known as the Magnificat. Her song resonates with individuals who identify with her lowliness. Their hearts long to sing the Magnificat's liberating praise. And yet, institutional religion can tend to nurture problematic habits, and congregations can harbor the proud, the powerful and the rich. But Mary declares that we are to be in the business of inspiring the spirit to rejoice in God – and we are to equip souls to magnify God.

One of the ways we can do this is by looking on the lowly with love and compassion. Just consider: How can a soul magnify God when our collective gaze notices only those whom the powers and principalities of this world prefer us to see? The Magnificat points to our prideful hearts as ground zero of this epidemic, and Mary's song echoes the promise that God remembers the lowly with mercy. Never forget that God's church also needs to remember the lowly and look on them with favor.




Children's Message/Prayer for Illumination

And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leapt for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord.'

And Mary said, 'My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. He has brought down the powerful from their thrones and lifted up the lowly; he has filled the hungry with good things and sent the rich away empty. He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants forever.' And Mary remained with her for about three months and then returned to her home.
