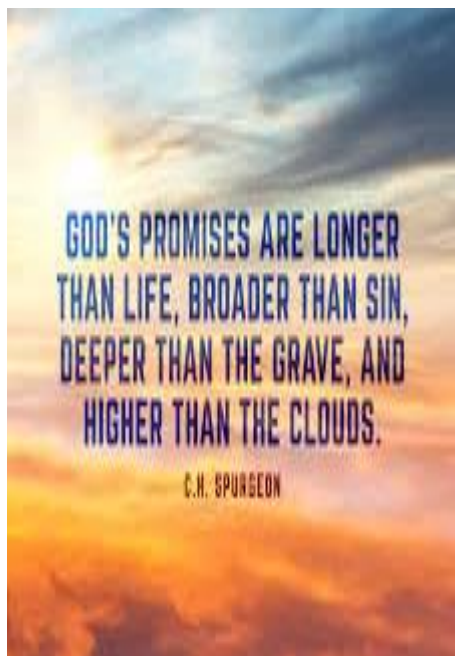

Preparing Ourselves for Worship During the Prelude...



God's promises last forever, but sometimes our promises to God are a little shaky. Case in point:

The man who was driving down the street, desperately searching for a parking place so he wouldn't be late for an important meeting. In desperation, he gazed into the heavens and prayed, "Lord, take pity on me. If you find me a parking place, I promise to go to church every Sunday for the rest of my life and give up whiskey!" Instantly, a parking place opened up before him and he took it, whereupon he looked up to heaven again and said, "Never mind, I found one.."

Just before the death of actor, W. C. Fields, a friend visited his hospital room and was surprised to find him thumbing through a Bible. Asked what he was doing with a Bible, Fields replied, "I'm looking for loopholes."

The God who made us and loves us keeps his promises. God made a covenant with Abram which has been passed down to us. Are we keeping up our part of the covenant relationship, or are we constantly looking for loopholes to get out of it? During this holy season, consider ways that you might be more faithful to your covenant with God.

Call to Worship

- L: The Lord entered into a covenant with Abram and Sarai, and not only with them, but also with us.
- P: *The sign of the covenant was that their names were changed to Abraham and Sarah.***
- L: At times, they doubted God because of their old age, and the miraculous nature of God's promise.
- P: *At times, we too doubt God's promises because of our sin.***
- A: *But the Lord is God, and the covenant is everlasting, so we come today to celebrate our covenant with our God!***

The Sign of the Covenant

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the Lord appeared to Abram, and said to him, 'I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous.' Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, 'As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. I will establish my covenant between me and you, and your offspring after you throughout their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you.

God said to Abraham, 'As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. I will bless her, and moreover I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall give rise to nations; kings of peoples shall come from her.'



Second Lesson

Mark 8: 31-38

Jesus Foretells of His Death and Resurrection

Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, 'Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.'

He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels.'
