Preparing Ourselves for Worship During the Prelude...



Scripture calls us to stand firm in the Lord. Just how are we to do that? I don't think it is a call to stand firm in claims about birth or family, self-righteousness or personal accomplishment. These are temptations to false pride, and they can support us only so far against doubts, and the challenges our faith itself invites.

So, how shall we "stand firm" in the face of peer pressure or the challenge of popularity? We all are naturally hungry to be accepted, although it is especially important to young people to be one of the gang, or to fit in. Some will go so far as to go down pathways of self-destructive practices. How hard it is at age 16 to conceive of the need for basic good health at age 47, or at age 47 to imagine the challenges of being 87.

By standing firm in our commitment to the Lord, each of us can be sure of being the best possible person later in life. Here, though, Paul is exhorting fellow believers to hold fast to their faith, to persevere in it, even in the face of social pressure, business demands, marital difficulties, health challenges, and family emergencies. Standing firm in our faith in the Lord Jesus Christ offers victory in body, mind and spirit – which is the strength to cope with all that confronts us.

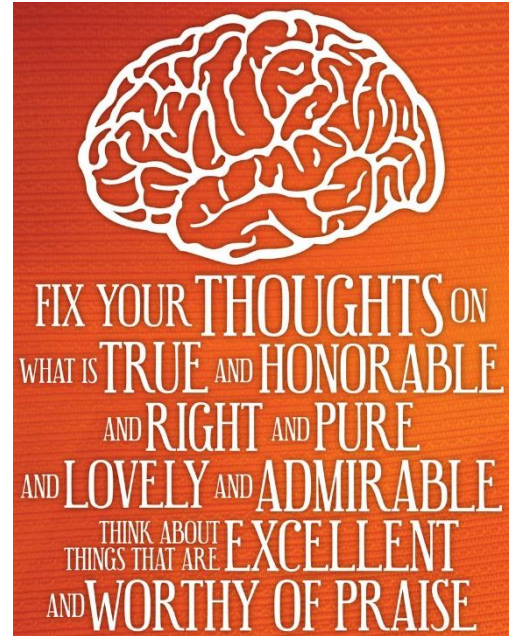

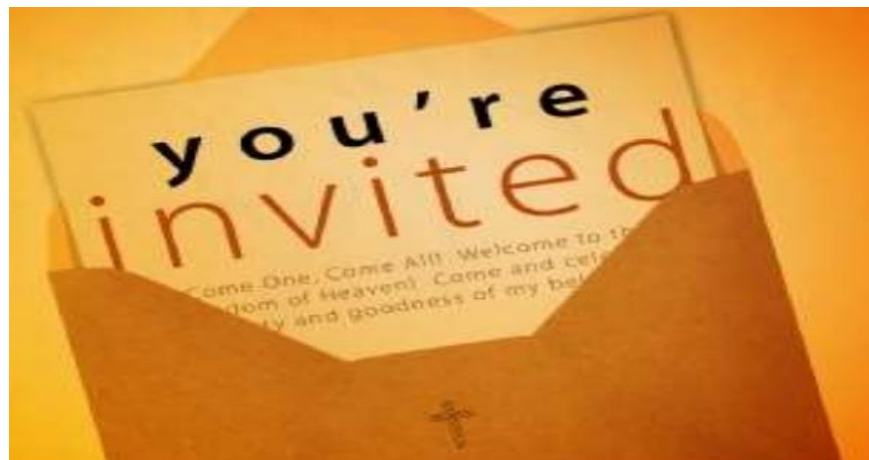
Second Lesson

Matthew 22: 1-14

The Parable of the Wedding Banquet

Once more Jesus spoke to them in parables, saying: ²The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son. He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet, but they would not come. Again he sent other slaves, saying, "Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet." But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business, ⁶while the rest seized his slaves, maltreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged. He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his slaves, "The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. Go therefore into the main streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet." Those slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests.

'But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing a wedding robe, and he said to him, "Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding robe?" And he was speechless. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."
