Preparing Ourselves for Worship During the Prelude...

For most of us, Christmas is a favorite time of year. There is just something special about the season - gathering with family and friends, sharing love and gifts with one another, being surrounded by beautiful displays of decorations, the familiar carols we enjoy, and the special worship services we have to give thanks for the birth of Jesus. There is no command in scripture to celebrate Christmas, but we happily join with millions of Christians around the world to remember the birth of our Savior. "Joy to the world, the Lord is come!"

Advent is about preparing ourselves for this important season in the liturgical year. So, this Sunday, which is Christ the King Sunday, is the last Sunday of this liturgical year, and it is the perfect time to prepare for the Advent season which begins next Sunday. We gladly anticipate Advent, and Jesus being born in Bethlehem, in order that "the hopes and fears of all the year" will be met in him.

Preparation of the Sanctuary

Call to Worship

L: In the days to come, the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised above the hill; all the nations shall stream to it. Many people shall come and say:

P: ***"Come, let us go up the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob; that God may teach us God's ways, and that we may walk in God's paths."***

L: With what shall we come to God's house?

P: ***Bring branches of cedar and holly, bring evergreens and a pine tree, hand wreaths and garlands.***

L: Make the church fragrant with the smell of living things. Bring candles and light to dispel the darkness.

P: ***In acts of hanging greens and lighting candles and listening to the words of prophets and seers, let us make our hearts, and this space, a place of inward and outward preparation, for the One who comes to give us second birth.***


O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel,

**Hanging of the Greens**

L: People of God, all around us are the doors of our church, where we enter and exit week after week. Today we stand at the doorway to the Christian year which begins next Sunday, on the first Sunday of Advent. Today, on Christ the King Sunday, we finish up this year, and we prepare ourselves and our church, to receive again the promise of new life and light. In a moment, we will mark the entrances of the sanctuary with wreaths.

P: So, let us also mark our hearts and minds, as portals for Christ to enter as we pray, Come, Lord Jesus, come!

L: As the psalmist writes: Lift up your heads, O gates! And be lifted up, O ancient doors,

P: That the Ruler of glory may come in.

L: Who is the Ruler of glory?

P: The Lord of hosts, the Lord is the Ruler of glory!

L: Friends, how will we make this sanctuary a reminder of our need for forgiveness and new life – of God's constant faithfulness – and of the hope that we have in Jesus Christ?

P: Let us hang greens, and place seasonal plants, as Hosea speaks the Word of God.

First Lesson*Hosea 14: 4-9*

It is I who answer and look after you. I am like an evergreen cypress; your faithfulness comes from me. Those who are wise understand these things; those who are discerning know them. For the ways of the Lord are right, and the upright walk in them, but transgressors stumble in them.

The Lighting of the Christmas Tree

L: God, the Holy One of Israel, is a God of comfort and compassion. With the Christmas tree, we remember God's everlasting promises to the poor and needy. Isaiah spoke of God's making of the wilderness a place of blessing – one where water and plants, even pine trees, would manifest God's loving action to save and provide for all of creation.

Second Lesson*Unison Reading of Isaiah 41: 17-20*

When the poor and needy seek water, and there is none, and their tongue is parched with thirst, I the Lord will answer them, I the God of Israel will not forsake them. I will open rivers on the bare heights, and fountains in the midst of the valleys; I will make the wilderness a pool of water, and the dry land springs of water. I will put in the wilderness the cedar, the acacia, the myrtle, and the olive; I will set in the desert the cypress, the plane and the pine together, so that all may see and know, all may consider and understand, that the hand of the Lord has done this, the Holy One of Israel has created it.

**Hanging Chrismons as Symbols of Christ and Faith**

L: Here is this place, we prepare for the coming of the Lord. Here we will remember his advent, his birth in Bethlehem, weak and helpless as an infant. And here we rekindle our prayer, "Come, Lord Jesus" as we await his coming as the bright and morning star.

P: We will hang symbols and signs of Christ – ruler, prophet, priest. Hang stars, crosses, triangles, the alpha and the omega to remind us of his identity, his story, and the light of his love.

Matthew 24: 36-44 & Philippians 4: 12-13

'But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left.
