If you want bottled water, there are so many choices! And clearly Americans are responding. More than half of all Americans buy bottled water - a fact that boggles the mind when one considers that our country has some of the cleanest tap water in the world. Yet, the sales of bottled drinking water have become a \$4 billion industry in our country alone!

We do this even though there's no guarantee that the plastic-encased liquid will be any purer than what is available from your own kitchen sink - and it probably isn't. Visions of remote mountain springs vanish when one realizes that *Dasani* (made by Coca-Cola) is simply purified tap water. In fact, most bottled water you might buy in the supermarket is *purified* faucet fluid, rather than "source" water, i.e. a bubbling spring or something like that.

This is a critical distinction, because it's *what* we drink and the *source* of that drink that really matters. This is an important distinction particularly if you're in a developing country in the Third World where truly pure water isn't readily available. If you're in the United States, however, it's simply a lifestyle choice. How interesting that no bottled-water company has been able to give the world water which quenches our thirst forever. For that, we have to look to Jesus.

First Lesson*Exodus 17: 1-7**The People Quarrel With Moses**Lay Leader*

From the wilderness of Sin the whole congregation of the Israelites journeyed by stages, as the Lord commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. The people quarreled with Moses, and said, 'Give us water to drink.' Moses said to them, 'Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you test the Lord?' But the people thirsted there for water; and the people complained against Moses and said, 'Why did you bring us out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and livestock with thirst? So Moses cried out to the Lord, 'What shall I do with this people? They are almost ready to stone me.' The Lord said to Moses, 'Go on ahead of the people, and take some of the elders of Israel with you; take in your hand the staff with which you struck the Nile, and go. I will be standing there in front of you on the rock at Horeb. Strike the rock, and water will come out of it, so that the people may drink.' Moses did so, in the sight of the elders of Israel. He called the place

Massah and Meribah, because the Israelites quarreled and tested the Lord, saying, 'Is the Lord among us or not?'

L: This is the Word of the Lord. **P:** *Thanks be to God.*

Second Reading*John 4: 5-15, 21-26, 28-30, 39-42**Carol*

So he came to a Samaritan city called Sychar, near the plot of ground that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired out by his journey, was sitting by the well. It was about noon.

A Samaritan woman came to draw water, and Jesus said to her, 'Give me a drink'. (His disciples had gone to the city to buy food.) The Samaritan woman said to him, 'How is it that you, a Jew, ask a drink of me, a woman of Samaria?' (Jews do not share things in common with Samaritans.) Jesus answered her, 'If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, "Give me a drink", you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water.' The woman said to him, 'Sir, you have no bucket, and the well is deep. Where do you get that living water? Are you greater than our ancestor Jacob, who gave us the well, and with his sons and his flocks drank from it?'



Jesus said to her, 'Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give

will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life.’ The woman said to him, ‘Sir, give me this water, so that I may never be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water.’ Jesus said to her, ‘Woman, believe me, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father seeks such as these to worship him. God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth.’ The woman said to him, ‘I know that Messiah is coming’ (who is called Christ). ‘When he comes, he will proclaim all things to us.’ Jesus said to her, ‘I am he, the one who is speaking to you.’

Then the woman left her water-jar and went back to the city. She said to the people, ‘Come and see a man who told me everything I have ever done! He cannot be the Messiah, can he?’ They left the city and were on their way to him.

Many Samaritans from that city believed in him because of the woman’s testimony, ‘He told me everything I have ever done.’ So when the Samaritans came to him, they asked him to stay with them; and he stayed there for two days. And many more believed because of his word. They said to the woman, ‘It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the Savior of the world.’

L: This is the Word of the Lord. **P:** *Thanks be to God.*

P: ***And we affirm, "The Lord our God is among us."***

L: Now you set out for another place, leaving behind the oasis and coming into the wilderness. Food is scarce, and again, you have a complaining spirit.

P: ***And we cry in despair, "Is the Lord among us or against us?"***

L: But the Lord sends quail in the evening and manna in the morning, and all of you are filled.

P: ***And we affirm, "The Lord our God is among us."***

L: Now you move on from the wilderness, making camp after another day. But again, you have no water to drink and you murmur against Moses.

P: ***And we cry out, "Why did you bring us up out of Egypt? Will you kill us and our children with thirst?" And you, once again, mutter against the Lord asking, "Is the Lord among us or against us?"***

L: Then the Lord shows Moses a rock, and water flows from it and your thirst is quenched.

P: ***And we affirm, "The Lord our God is among us."***

L: O faithless generation, have you believed only because you have seen signs? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe!

A: ***We believe, O Lord! Forgive our unbelief and help us to believe without seeing.***
